Confirmation of Minutes from 29th AGM held on 14th November 2022:

The minutes were available for reading. Anka Browne moved the minutes be accepted as being true and correct, seconded by Phil Saxton. Motion was carried.

Annual Report:

Copies were made available at the meeting and will be distributed electronically and on website.

Chairman's Report:

Anka Browne spoke to the report.

The report was moved by Anka Browne, seconded by Dave Merritt, carried.

Greg spoke about the enormous contribution to the club that Peter McGuinness made right up until his passing. A letter will be sent to Suzie.

Phil spoke about the funding that we have received.

Treasurer's Report:

As Brian was unable to attend the AGM due to illness the report was tabled, questions were recorded and will be answered via email to those that attended and included in the minutes.

The report was moved by Anka Browne, seconded by Neville Heffernan subject to questions being answered.

There was discussion around whether the club could seek other means of income in the off season? Nick mentioned that a social committee had been formed and is planning events throughout the year to hopefully increase bar revenue.

There was discussion about the replacement insurance. Dave explained that replacement was not necessarily for at the Hutt Rec but could be wherever and the Indemnity insurance was not significantly cheaper.

The following questions were asked and responses recorded in minutes after the meeting:

What makes up the Debtors and Prepayments, as well as the Payables?

Debtors largely include sponsorship paid subsequent to year, payable normal supplier invoices paid subsequent to year end

Whilst player subs nearly doubled from last year, it is still well down on expectations and really only covers the affiliation fees to the WRFU, so what is included in Team Expenses & Hospitality which is up by 40% on last year.

Costs of catering for home premier games, complying with our liquor license to have food available when serving alcohol including long room, cost of hosting generally

Previous years sponsorship revenue adjusted down by \$2k and loss increased by the same. As last year's financials have been audited and filed with the incorporated societies, why wasn't this non-payment of sponsorship from last year reflected in this year's financials, as there shouldn't be any changes made to prior years filings.

Could the expenditure information in the report be more detailed? Especially some of the larger items of expense.

Review the 2024 disclosures with associated 2023 items

Could a Cashflow report be included? Included in 2023 filings

Should the bank balances from the Eagles Supporters Club be offset by the current liability - ESC Account?

Why are the clubrooms listed as an asset of \$3m.

This is as per the valuation. As part of our land lease agreement with the council we are required to insure the clubrooms to replace them, so the true value should be recorded as the asset.

Director of Rugby Report

Kent spoke to his report.

Neville asked about colts for next year. Kent said that this is looking strong, new coaches and managers. Numbers should be good.

Neville mentioned the 85's doing well this year but when playing New Plymouth it was obvious that that team was made up of Premier level players. Did we discuss with the 85's about using some eligible Premier players? Kent advised that the rules of the tournament only allow for 26 players in the roster so you cannot bring in players.

Phil said to be successful you need 3 teams. Prem Reserves are a concern but we are not in danger of losing 3 teams next year. Kent said that growth across rugby is a struggle and we have to maintain current numbers.

Dave said that we have never been this organised for the next season and is evidence of our 2-3 year plan working.

Greg gave an update on the vote for premier eligibility. Russell advised that the sub committee is looking at the bylaws and planning for different scenarios.

There was a discussion about game on rules and that it would be good for Colts. Nick thought it would be good at Prem Reserves level too.

Election of President:

Neville nominated Greg Hooper to the office of President, which was seconded by Mike Upton. There being no other nominations the motion was carried.

Election of Auditor:

Mike nominated Todrick Taylor as the Auditor, which was seconded by Phil. The motion was carried.

Election of Honorary Solicitor:

Phil moved that Nigel Stirling, Gibson Sheat be re-appointed as Honorary Solicitor, which was Seconded by Anka. The motion was carried.

Election of Treasurer:

John Persico moved that Brian Hall be re-appointed as Treasurer, which was Seconded by Jim. There being no other nominations the motion was carried.

Election of Secretary:

Neville moved that Pat Braid be re-appointed as Secretary, which was seconded by Jim. There being no other nominations the motion was carried.

Election of Committee:

TREASURERS REPORT

Overview

- The Senior club recorded a small profit of \$1.6k for the 2024 season after providing for non-cash charge for depreciation of \$13k
- Your committee has carried out significant property maintenance & renovations over the last year including:
 - Painting the exterior of the clubrooms
 - Replacing the upstairs windows & ground floor windows
 - Painting and renovating both the clubroom and greenroom roofs
- Over \$120k has been spent bringing the exterior of both buildings up to scratch.
- Painting of Greenroom cladding is scheduled over the summer break
- Financing the operations of the club requires substantial funding to cover business as usual cash operating costs of ~\$250k p.a
- The club depends greatly on funding from its sponsors, \$142k this year. I want to acknowledge the Sponsorship subcommittee for their continued great work in this space.
- Grants from the gaming trusts continue to be vital sources of club funding and Silverlake money:
 - Funding ~\$80k for the maintenance activities
 - Funding of DOR \$40k and gear and equipment for of \$33k.
 - Funding the window replacements upstairs downstairs
- The Eagles Supporters Club "ESC" continue to provide valuable financial contribution towards player development.
- The annual golf fundraiser was another resounding success both socially and financially.
- Income from the Bar operations was up due largely due to increasing prices and expanded product range.
- Player subscriptions were back up to expectations. The team managers and the players all played their part in a very satisfying outcome.
- Investment in DOR was \$90k for the full year, 2023-part year DOR/RDO \$68k. Grant funding for DOR obtained \$40k, previously WRFU funded the RDO cost to \$30K

Property

- Clubrooms & Greenrooms independently valued for insurance purposes at replacement cost of \$3.815m
- This latest replacement cost is included in the club's balance sheet as information members should be aware of and it is a source of cost, particularly insurance, rates & maintenance.
- Major maintenance program completed after a concerted commitment by the committee (special mention to contribution made by Peter McGuinness before his untimely passing)

Financial Matters Subsequent to Year End

- Receipt of Gant funding included in Debtors (\$20k) and payment of last installment for the painting included in Creditors
- Receipt of grant funding for the 2025 season:
 - o DOR-\$20k
 - Operations- \$20K

DIRECTOR OF RUGBY REPORT

It has been another eventful year at the club in 2024. We have come a long way in recent seasons and the culture at the club has been taking positive steps forward each year. The success of the year is headlined by having 3 teams make the Top 4 of their respective competitions and the incredible success of our Colts side.

After what would have been one of the most populated pre-seasons in recent memory, our colts side started the season with enough new faces to start their own team – yet alone the majority of players who had returned from last season! It was a great sign of the relationships with the schools to have so many new school leavers join the Eagles family and many of these school leavers made an automatic impression with the side.

After a pre-season that indicated the special season ahead, including an impressive display in an away trip to Fielding, the Colts raced out of the blocks in the early stages of the first round. Picking up key victories over rivals and the inaugural Peter McGuiness Trophy (against MSP), the Colts did a clean sweep through all 13 games to win the Paris Memorial Trophy on a perfect 65 points. They headed to the final of the John E Kelly Memorial as firm favourites against Tawa and did not disappoint the supporters as they picked up the elusive win with a dominant 49-19 victory.

The season for the Premiers likewise started off on an encouraging note. Attending the annual 'Spillane' tournament and returning to the first division, the Premiers walked away with the title for the first time since 2019. The start to the Swindale shield was also a fast one, notching up some early wins, before some tough matches in the middle stretch. Still, the side managed to improve on last years record and qualify for the Jubilee round with a 9 from 13 record. This earned them a 3rd place finish and an opportunity to win a week off in the Top 4 qualifiers. Aiming for revenge on the McBain loss, the HOBM side prevailed in a convincing win against Petone 37-15, earning themselves their 3rd home semi-final in the past 4 years. In a game that was much tighter than the 22-33 scoreline may suggest, we fell agonisingly short to eventual winners OBU.

In other grades the success continued with the Prem Reserves achieving a respectable record of 10 from 13 in the Harper Lock Shield. Qualifying for the Ed Chaney Division, the side fell short in the semi-finals. The 85's have continued to show fast progress and this year achieved promotion to the Paul Potiki play-off rounds.

The strength of the season has been underpinned by an intentional effort across the club to develop unity and a 'One Club' approach. There has been success in our efforts to streamline game plans, connect players across all grades and develop players from within. It is no surprise that the success of our teams has therefore been consistent across all the grades. Next season we are hopeful to build on this to push a little further.

We are in a space with lots of promising young players coming through the grades, with some systems and culture in place to grow and accelerate this. This could not be possible without the incredible effort given by our Coaching and Management staff, who sacrifice a large amount of time throughout the season. Nor would it be as effective without the work

done by the club and committee behind the scenes ensuring we are never lacking in our endeavours. I look forward to another exciting season in 2025!

JUNIORS

This season the junior club had 300 registered players from Little Ruggaz through to Year 8 tackle. This is again a decrease from last season; however, we did have more teams entered in the regular Saturday competition. The decrease in numbers has followed a similar trend since Covid in 2020. To combat this, Loren Peters with the help of former player Jonno Bailey will again approach local primary schools in the new year and run clinics to try and encourage more children to join the club. Loren has also successfully implemented a tackle clinic aimed at Year 2 rippers to give them confidence going into their first year of tackle in year 3.

This year was the first time Wellington Junior rugby had no weight restrictions in all grades. However, there were still weight guidelines if smaller kids wished to play down, and larger kids were able to play up if they wanted. This had mixed reviews not just from within our club but from the whole region. It will remain the same for next year and is being monitored by Wellington rugby. There is no easy fix for this issue, especially with decreased playing numbers across the region.

There were 16 rounds of rugby this season without 1 cancellation due to weather or ground conditions. We do continue to have issues with Mexteds reluctance to allow us to use the main grounds at the back end of the season, grades 6, 7 and 8 played very little rugby on our home patch in the last 5 weeks.

We were however, able to host Paremata-Plimmerton for the first time in 6 years, a fantastic Sunday morning of rugby resulting in HOBM retaining the cup for a second year in a row The exchange at Paraparaumu was unfortunately cancelled by the hosts due to foul weather on the day.

This year's Manly Tour got under way in September school holidays with 2 teams (under 11s and 12s) heading to Sydney. After speaking with several parents and a number of the kids on return, it was obvious the tour was a success. EAGLES SUPPORTERS CLUB REPORT

The Eagles Supporters Club is a vehicle for individual club members to contribute financially to HOBM RFC and is separate from corporate sponsorship of the Club. All Eagles Supporters Club members are automatically honorary members of the Club. There are three membership levels depending on the amount of financial contribution which is set at either of \$10 (Silver), or \$20 (Gold) or \$50 (Platinum) per month.

The Eagles Supporters Club primary objective is to "assist the main club committee maintain a financially secure and sustainable rugby club and maintain the goal of being the leading and most professionally run rugby club within Wellington rugby". Practically speaking - this is achieved via funding from the Eagles Supporters Club for the likes of player and coaching development, assisting with new or replacement capital assets the Club requires, providing training resources, supporting the Clubs rugby programmes and Colleges. And not least, to assist with building a strong sense of community and belonging to the Club by and for our members. Funding requests are initiated via formal application to the Eagle Supporters Club Trustees and all requests must firstly meet Eagles Supporters Club objectives and secondly Wellington Rugby Union by laws.

Distributions for the year ended 30 September 2024 numbered 7 and totalled \$16,029 (6 distributions were funded in 12 months ended 30 September 2023 totalling \$10,848). Individual distributions for 2024 are detailed below.

Detail of funding

50% contribution of the capital cost to the replacement of the projector equipment situated in the main club rooms.

Assist HOBM with meeting some of the costs associated with attending the annual tournament.

Funding to assist with key initiatives driven by the Club's Director of Coaching. More specifically, pre-season conditioning / personal training \$1,700, game day video recording of both Premier teams throughout the season \$2,000, pre-season camps for Premier & Colts \$1,800 & annual subscription to coaching web site The Rugby Site Membership \$250 Three separate funding distributions for rugby jersey sponsorship – this is an regular annual commitment.

Partial funding to meet r&m on HOBM RFC indoor training facility - external repairs and maintenance consisting of repair to the roof followed by rust treatment and full paint of the exterior of the building. Full cost of the repair \$14,710 exclusive GST (Main Club and Junior Club funded the remainder).

Total Eagles Supporters Club annual member contributions under its current structure (since 1 January 2015) as at 30 September 2024, total \$130,268 (includes interest earned on members funds).

Total approved distributions over the same relevant period total \$123,477 (excludes any costs).

The Eagles Supporters Club experienced a reduction in members for YE 2024 ending the year with 43 members compared with 50 for YE 2023 an overall net loss of 7 members. On behalf of the Eagles Supporters Club Trustees and indeed the HOBM RFC Committee, a sincere thank you for your continued support of our Club. Total annual member contributions plus interest from 1 October 2023 to 30 September 2024 amounted to \$12,791 (\$13,606 for the previous year). Well done to each of you. Simply brilliant.

Your committee members on the Eagles Supporters Club are Dave Rose (Trustee), Nigel Stirling (Trustee) and Mike Hally (Trustee). A big thank you to Dave and Nigel.
